Establish Quorum and Acknowledge Alternates-None

Adoption of the Agenda: Amended MSP
Item 5-Equity and curriculum was discussed before establishing quorum.

Approval of December 3, 2019 minutes: MSP with revisions.

Public Commentary (3 minutes per speaker):
Kathleen Reiland, Dean of CTE, shared with committee that Cypress College ranked 437th of 4000 colleges that students may earn more money in the long run over a ten-year period.

Equity and Curriculum: Joyce Peacock and Jacky Rangel
Both Joyce and Jacky attended a day training at Orange County Department of Education. The program was a jump start to the Equity training that Jacky and Joyce will be participating all semester long. The equity training, they receive will aide in their work in looking at curriculum through an equity lens. More information will be presented to the committee as they move forward in trainings and conferences for equity.

Cultural Diversity subcommittee: Establish membership, schedule spring meetings
Subcommittee members were appointed: Danny Lind, Jacky Rangel, Joseph Melodia, Jane Jepson and Joyce Peacock. They will be meeting on Tuesday's when curriculum is not in session. The first meeting will be on February 11, 2020 at 3:00 p.m. More details will be provided by the Curriculum Chair.

Curriculum Specialist Report: Marbelly Jairam-Curriculum submissions progress and other updates

Curriculum specialist shared with committee members that pre-launch has closed. We have 245 courses and 34 programs in our approval process for Fall 2021. An excel sheet is available for all committee members to view in Canvas that provides the list of courses and programs going through the Fall 2021 approval process. She also shared that we have about 300 additional courses that still need to be pre-launched and reviewed. She will be working with curriculum chair to come up with a plan of action. More details to come.

Articulation Report: Jacky Rangel, Articulation Officer

Jacky shared with committee an update of the Bachelor's degree pilot (BDP) program for the 15 Community Colleges that offer a BDP. The Legislature Analyst Office (LAO) report that was published January 23 did not favor the Bachelor's degree programs. The report did not state if they support or do not support the programs and instead summarized that the LAO did not find that BDP programs were any better at preparing our students for success in their chosen fields. She will provide a link to the study which will be available in Canvas. Jacky also asked the committee if they would be interested in holding curriculum review sessions with their faculty on the Tuesday's when curriculum is not in session. She had the support of the committee and will be scheduling any meetings with faculty during those Tuesdays. She also stated that the curriculum representative must be in attendance with their faculty in order to get assistance as it is important for the rep to be kept in the loop for their division's curriculum.

Chair Report

1. C-ID reviewers-Faculty members are needed to review C-ID courses. Curriculum Chair will be posting more information on Canvas.
2. Curriculum cycle-Curriculum chair reviewed curriculum cycle and asked library for assistance. The library curriculum rep will be reviewing textbooks, course materials and confirming screen including the librarian name at Level 3 approvals.
3. Vice President of Instruction-Curriculum chair shared with committee that Dean Reiland will be overseeing curriculum and related matters such as attendance at DCCC, until a Vice President of Instruction is selected.

To earn an Associate Degree students must complete: (1) 21 units with a grade of C or better; (2) Cypress College Native General Education requirements; California State University General Education Breadth requirements (CSU GE Breadth) or IGETC General Education requirements, including the cultural diversity and reading requirements and any elective courses to complete a minimum of 60 units; and, (3) have a minimum GPA of 2.0.
