Chair Report

Reading Proficiency update-Kathleen McAlister shared the English Dept consensus on new reading requirements and these will be retroactive:

- 1) Completion of a degree (AA/AS or higher) from a US regionally accredited college or university.
- 2) A Cypress College placement test score indicating proficiency has been met or passing the Cypress College reading proficiency test (CTEP 60 or Nelson-Deny 225) prior to Fall 2019.
- 3) A passing grade of "C" or better in ENGL 096 C or ENGL 102 C or a comparable course at a regionally accredited college or university.
- 4) A passing grade of "C" or better in any course in the IGETC (1B); or CSU GE (A3) Critical Thinking category.
- 5) A passing grade of "C" or better in the Cypress College AA/AS degree General Education pattern Area A2 (Analytical Thinking) or a comparable course at a regionally accredited college or university.



Program submission update: Jacky reported that there's about four to five programs pending. Jacky also reported that all fall 2019 revised courses have been updated.

Degree Works was discussed and David Soto reported that by the end of this month, all programs will be in Degree Works.

The ASCCC is hosting an ESL re-coding event from 11 to 3 p.m., discussing CB21 in room CCPLX 414 on Wednesday, 09/11.

ADT discussion as related to Program Mapper: Silvie asked members to review- along with department coordinators, faculty and discipline counselors - their discipline ADTs in Program Mapper; specifically, to review individual courses listed on the discipline map and their relevance to discipline degree requirements and ADT discipline template.

Catalog edits update: Laurie reported that the catalog will be published on October 1, 2019 and, currently, is pending additional revisions e.g. Health Science division and software "clean up" by Courseleaf, our Catalog vendor.

Master Plan – Curriculum in the next 10 years: committee brainstormed challenges, opportunities, process and support as related to curriculum.

Discussion of last week's training and its relevance: overall positive feedback. Discussion of committee constituents and identifying potential areas of improvement such as addition of liaisons/resources.

Total units change from 29-31 to 26-28</p> <p>The majority of jobs in archaeology today are in private archaeology firms or government agencies within the field of Cultural Resource Management (hereafter CRM). Although a career in archaeology will eventually require at least a bachelor's degree (BA or BS) in Anthropology, entry level positions in CRM firms may not require a degree. In such cases, CRM firms look for employees with some level of experience in archaeological field methods and archaeological theory. This certificate provides students entering the CRM field with a statement of their preparedness in both method and theory, making them more marketable to CRM firms and a more attractive applicant to transfer colleges and universities.</p>
