#### **CPL Coordinator Report**

Coordinator shared with committee that AB 927, which reached the governor desk, will allow the current 15 community colleges to continue to offer the bachelor's degree and remove the pilot program status. It will also give opportunity to other community colleges to offer a baccalaureate degree which has been limited to 15 districts to participate. Coordinator also shared that our current CPL form will need to be revised since it states that it will not grant units from noncollegiate instruction.

This degree requires a total of 18 units in the major, in addition to general graduation requirements.
